Hoophouses for Health

With funding from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, Hoophouses for Health can provide five year, zero-interest loans to build hoophouse(s), increasing your ability to provide healthy, locally produced foods for an extended season.



Hoophouses for Health is a program that can help you extend your growing season, increasing access to fresh, healthy food for vulnerable families. To be eligible for funding you must:

- Be a resident of Michigan
- Sell product at a Michigan farmers market participating in this program
- Be able to provide proof of land ownership or land lease agreement
- Be willing to finance 25% of the total project cost
- Keep your loan request under \$15,000
- Participate in required record keeping
- Attend Hoophouses for Health webinars, meetings, and workshops
